REFLECTIONS ON GOD'S WORD

Amos 7:12-15 Amos, the shepherd, chosen by God to prophesy, found no welcome in Israel. There he publicly announced that the king would die by the sword and that the people would be led away captive. Amaziah, the priest of Bethel in Israel, banished Amos from the northern kingdom and commanded him to leave for the southern kingdom, Judah. Amos denounced the pride and callousness of the people of Israel who had turned away from the Torah. This prophet was not one by profession and neither desired nor sought his prophetic task. Sometimes the least likely are called to act in God's name and, as with Amos, are "taken" by a spirit stronger than their reluctance.

Ephesians 1:3-14 Paul describes the benefits of being a follower of Christ. What is this inheritance that is coming to us? Simply this: all that God has prepared for Christ is going to be ours as well. This includes salvation from sin, everlasting life, and the kingdom of God. Is this just wishful thinking? No, God is already giving us glimpses of that inconceivable future. The Holy Spirit lives inside us as a guarantee of things to come. He "seals" us, assuring that we remain in God's family and do not lose our inheritance. And while we move toward that day, He works within our lives to make us like Christ.

Mark 6:7-13 Immediately following the break with Nazareth and his own, Jesus initiates the mission of the Twelve. He sends out the twelve disciples, giving them authority to do what he himself had been doing: to prepare for the Kingdom by preaching repentance, healing, and exorcising. Going out "two by two" provides fellowship, support, encouragement, accountability, and adequate witness. Jesus required of his disciples a total dependence upon God for their needs. Just as Amos had been rejected by Israel, the disciples are instructed to "shake the dust" from their feet as testimony against those who reject the call to repentance. This missionary journey prepared the disciples for the future, when they will have to function as apostles in Jesus' absence.
